

**JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS’
PROCEEDINGS
March 8, 2021**

At 8:32 A.M., Chair Sandquist called the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors to order.

Board members present were: Dee Sandquist, Chairman; Susie Drish, Vice-Chairman; Daryn Hamilton, Supervisor.

It was moved by Drish, seconded by Hamilton that the minutes for the February 26th and March 1st, 2021 meetings be acknowledged. All “Aye”. Motion carried.

Pursuant to Sections 50.24 of the 2021 Code of Iowa, the Board of Supervisors meeting as a Board of Canvassers, publicly opened and canvassed the tally list of votes cast in the March 2, 2021 Special School Election for Cardinal as certified by the election board of the voting precinct. The Official Canvass was completed on this date, March 8th, 2021. Upon completion of the canvass the County Commissioner of Elections will enter the votes in the Official Register.

It was moved by Hamilton, seconded by Drish to approve the election results as presented. All “Aye”. Motion carried.

The Board met with the County Engineer.

At 8:45 A.M., Hamilton moved, Drish seconded that the public hearing regarding the property tax dollar proposal be opened. All “Aye”. Motion carried.

Chair Sandquist called for public comments. Public comments received were as follows: None.

Hamilton moved, Drish seconded to close the public hearing. All "Aye". Motion carried.

Drish reported on her DCAT meeting. Hamilton reported on his Safety Committee meeting. Sandquist reported on her Pathfinders meeting.

It was moved by Drish, seconded by Hamilton that the following resolution be approved:

Approval of FY22 Maximum Property Tax Dollars

WHEREAS, the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors have considered the proposed FY22 county maximum property tax dollars for both General County Services and Rural County Services, and

WHEREAS, a notice concerning the proposed county maximum property tax dollars was published as required and posted on county web site and/or social media accounts if applicable,

WHEREAS, a public hearing concerning the proposed county maximum property tax dollars was held on March 8, 2021,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Jefferson County that the maximum property tax dollars for General County Services and Rural County Services for FY22 shall not exceed the following:

General County Services- \$5,581,025

Rural County Services- \$1,031,194

The Maximum Property Tax dollars requested in either General County Services or Rural County Services for FY22 does not represent an increase of 102% from the Maximum Property Tax dollars requested for FY 21.
